

## Free Data Workshop

### A Focus on Head Start Family & Child Experiences Survey (FACES 2014) and Trends from FACES over Time

FACES 2014 is the sixth in a series of Head Start national studies, with earlier studies conducted every three years from 1997 to 2009. FACES provides national-level information on Head Start and details how it has changed over time. FACES 2014 features a new “Core Plus” study design, which places emphasis on tracking trends in key indicators, including information for performance measures. The Classroom + Child Outcomes Core was conducted in 60 programs during fall 2014 and spring 2015 and assessed the school readiness skills of Head Start children, surveyed their parents, and asked their Head Start teachers to rate children’s social-emotional skills. In spring 2015 and 2017, the program sample increased to 180 as part of the Classroom Core; Head Start classrooms were observed, and teachers, center directors, and program directors completed surveys.
